Port Road East, Wenvoe. is likely to provide up to 1,500 cremations and burials each year – but every relative and friend will be assured of friendly, caring assistance tai-lored for individual

needs Memoria Ltd chairman and chief operating offi-cer, Howard Hodgson, said the ethos is to pro-vide an exceptional service given by people who care. And all associated with the memorial park and crematorium have fully engaged with funeral directors and local clergy to ensure the whole process operates in a smooth manner.

The Memorial Park's chapel seats 76 people chapel seats 76 people with the option of expand-ing to 96. Up to 200 people can both stand and sit inside the venue, but more than 400 can be potentially be served, with the service piped outside into a pleasant outside into a pleasant undercover area.

Internet viewing of the service, accessible by code, is available for friends and family unable to attend the service. Plasma screens can provide pre-recorded eulo-gies or silent photographic memories.

Fourth-generation funeral director Howard Hodgson, who served his apprenticeship in Penarth office in the Summers of Cardiff, said:

'There had been a demand for this facility, but because the Vale is such a beautiful place, it had always resisted giving up agricultural land until the need became irresistible."

The site makes use of Welsh slate, limestone and sandstone and also incorporates space for natural burials, standard burials - with flat head-stones - all in-keeping with the tranquil sur-roundings. roundings.

A children's section will meet the needs of the bereaved and the beautifully landscaped grounds, tailor-made for each and every season, offer the perfect surroundings to honour the dearly departed and remember them with true affection.

The grounds offer a sanctuary and a place to visit long after death, and a permanent place where special memories remain

very much alive. Howard said: "A death is the most stressful time in all our lives. It's a sad and dreadful time.

There's nothing we can do to take away that pain,

do to take away that pain, but we can provide an excellent, kind and pro-fessional service." Vale of Glamorgan Memorial Park and Crematorium manager, Dean Williams said: "Our aim here is provide a first class service for the local community."
